The children are settling in well and are learning the rules and routines of school. Tapestry will be up and running within the next week. The children are making new friends and playing nicely together.

Our topic is **Amazing Me!** The children will be creating a display of self portraits.

REWARDS

NUMBERS

Each week we will have a number/maths focus. We will follow the 'White Rose' maths scheme to ensure children have a good foundation knowledge of numbers. Numberblocks programmes are really good for mathematical knowledge. They may like to practise studying the numbers, saying the number names, counting the amounts and practising writing the numerals.

PHONICS

Each week we will be learning sounds/letters using the 'Little Wandle' scheme for phonics.
All children take part in national phonics screening (at the end of Year 1) and need to

screening (at the end of Year 1) and need to have completed all 5 phases of phonics in order to pass. Therefore, we would be very grateful if you could regularly practise graphemes (letter names) and phonemes (sounds) at home.

From next week, in their bag will be a 'Caterpillar' sounds book. Please practise the sounds and tricky words in this, with your childat home, and when they can recognise them in any order, we will test them once a week, and glue in a new set of sounds in once learnt.

Extra parent support guidance will be sent using 'Little Wandle' materials, plus a reading and phonics workshop Wed 25th Sept 2:45pm Alphablocks TV programmes are a great place to start. Plus, 'Steve says - Cued articulation' videos on YouTube.

READING

We wish to foster a love of reading instilled within our pupils. On a Monday, your child was given a reading book to bring home – please read with your child 4 times a week and sign their reading record by writing the name of the book and a short comment. Children start with picture books with no words to help their imaginative story telling. Children will also be bringing home 'caterpillar words and sounds' to learn (see above). Guidance for both these activities are inside these books, and will be discussed at the 'Reading and phonics' session' (date Wed 25th Sept 2:45pm). At school the children will take part in daily guided reading activities including individual reading, learning a weekly text linked to our topic, and practising their caterpillar words.
