Spring term themes:

Magic and Powers! then Olden Days

We will focus on learning about lots of types of magic and powers through wonderful stories. We will use texts to signpost a variety of child-led activities including potion making, magical concepts, and dressing up.

Then, after half term, our topic is Olden days where we will look at stories, videos and objects from the past, focus on stories written by Janet and Allan Ahlberg, and we will have a trip to Chertsey museum

We also incorporate seasonal events into our days including making bird feeders and porridge, looking for signs of Winter and Spring, and the start of Lent in the run up to Easter.

Dear parents/carers,

Welcome back and Happy New Year! We hope you all have had a good break. This term we will be taking part in exciting, practical activities to enrich our topics. Mrs. White will teach the class with the support of Miss Davies, Miss Joseph and Miss Wade. Mrs Hayward will teach on a Wednesday, and Friday afternoon.

Overview:

A home learning newsletter with activity suggestions will be sent home on a Wednesday. This may be a maths or phonics activity, or to share an experience on Tapestry e.g. spotting daffodils on a Spring walk. The task will often be open ended and most activities will be practical or talk based. Every Monday the children will be given a levelled reading book. They will also be tested on the caterpillar words and sounds, so please keep practising these. Please comment and sign the reading record so we know you have read with your child at least four times a week. On a Friday, Ladybirds can select their own book for fun from our borrow book selection to take home.

Parents evening: For your reference, our Spring term Parents Evening meetings will be held this term on Monday 3rd and Tuesday 4th March, in the school hall. School Uniform:

Please ensure that your child is wearing the correct school uniform. On Tuesdays, children will need to wear to school their PE kit (red t-shirt, black shorts, red sweatshirt and black tracksuit trousers) for PE sessions which will take place in the afternoon. They will not require to wear uniform on this day. Children are not permitted to wear earrings in PE lessons, so earrings should be removed at home. **PLEASE MAKE SURE ALL UNIFORM IS LABELLED INCLUDING SHOES and P.E. KIT.**

Water Bottles: Please ensure your child brings in a **named** water bottle, that they recognise and can open, so that they can help themselves to a drink when needed. Children take their water bottle home every day to be washed and refilled. Children are welcome to bring a fruit/vegetable snack or two, although the council will supply free fruit. Milk bar is open at 10am every day.

We have high expectations of the children in Ladybirds and wish to celebrate their success. Your child and the class will be rewarded with stickers (for their individual sticker chart), certificates and raffle tickets and gems (whole class reward). These rewards will be given for effort, kindness, politeness and good behaviour and we know that you will enjoy sharing their achievements. We also send home 'proud clouds' which are notelet that can be completed at home and shared in class e.g. 'We are proud of James today as he got dressed all by himself'. 
